ABOUT NAIROBI


Kenya's capital of Nairobi is one of the largest and fastest-growing cities in Africa. A hub of African economics and commerce, it is also a melting pot of cultures, attractions, and demographics. QUICK FACTS:

- Nairobi is named after 'Enkare Nairobi' the Maasai term for the 'cool water' of the Maasai River
- It was established in 1899 & became a center for the coffee, tea & sisal industries
- Climate ranges from 48°F (9°C) in the winter to 83°F (28°C) at the height of summer
- Nairobi is almost 6,000 feet (1,795m) above sea level, & though you won't suffer altitude sickness, you may find yourself a little more breathless when active
- It is Kenya's cultural heart, from fine art & theater to local crafts
- It is the world's only city with a national park, & has been named one of Africa's top 10 destinations to visit



NAIROBI GIRAFFE CENTRE

The Nairobi Giraffe Centre is lauded worldwide for its conservation and education programs for Kenyan school children and offers guests an elevated feeding platform where you can meet the giraffes face to face and feed them by hand. The centre provides a safe haven for the endangered Rothschild giraffe, allowing them complete freedom in the wild while providing managed feeding and veterinary care. An information center provides short talks from experts, helping you to learn about the endangered Rothschild giraffe and the centre's importance, including breeding programs. The centre's charming tea house allows you to enjoy refreshments while indulging in some giraffe watching.

KAREN BLIXEN'S 'OUT OF AFRICA' HOME

Visit the perfectly-preserved historical farmhouse of renowned Danish author Karen Blixen, her home between 1914 and 1931. The farmhouse gained international fame through the release of 1985's 'Out of Africa' starring Robert Redford and Meryl Streep as Blixen and based on her autobiography.

Her estate has expansive and beautifully manicured gardens with views of the Ngong Hills, original furniture is still on display presenting a colonial grandeur, and a fascinating reflection of life for those early settlers. The museum shop offers her book, along with souvenirs and Kenyan handicrafts.


KIAMBETHU FARM

In the early 1900s, Europeans flocked to Kenya to establish export opportunities. Among them was AB McDonell, a pioneer of the tea industry. Now one of Kenya's largest exports, McDonell was among the first to grow tea in Kenya.

Kiambethu Farm has remained almost unchanged for over a century, passed down through five generations and producing exceptional Kenyan tea to this day. Guests can view the historic farm house, wander through the stunning gardens and plantations, learn the story of the property and the tea-making process and be guided through native forests containing an array of birdlife, as well as troupes of colobus monkeys.

Guests conclude their visit with a three-course buffet lunch and, of course, by sampling the fine produce of this fascinating historic tea farm.

KARUNGURU COFFEE PLANTATION TOUR

Karunguru has been producing coffee for almost a century on the outskirts of Nairobi.

A tour of the property explores the history of the farm and offers an introduction into the growing process. Guests can experience each stage of coffee's evolution from seedling to sipping, including the farming, harvesting and roasting processes.

Enjoy a buffet-style lunch, with much of the fresh produce grown on-site, before concluding the tour in the lush gardens with a coffee-tasting experience. The property's shop has an array of produce for sale, including its coffee and locally-crafted jams, honey and coffee soap.

Nairobi has plenty of contemporary retail opportunities, but is also highly encouraging of local artists and producers of every kind. From the rustic central marketplace where you will find up-cycled crafts, wood and soapstone carvings and traditional jewellery, to studios displaying exquisite artworks, ceramics and fabrics. Nairobi has so much creativity to offer.

KITENGELA GLASS

Creations in blown and stained glass, beads and unique handicrafts. Tour the factory and take a lesson in the art of blowing glass.

ZEBU

Presenting Annabelle Thom's hand bags, hats and other fashion accessories as well as belts made by Linda Camm.

A shopping complex in Karen district with a variety of shops, restaurants and food court

SAND STORM & KAZURI BEADS

Canvas and leather travel bags and travel accessories. Locally handmade ceramic pottery, jewellery and crockery.
